GLENN CAMHI

WRITER, DIRECTOR, EDITOR, PRODUCER



Glenn grew up in Stamford, CT. When his parents explained that the Muppets weren't actually walking from the country to the city instantly, but were using these things called "sets," he was hooked on filmmaking. By age 10 he was shooting Super 8 stopmotion animated films with clay figures, Star Wars models and the occasional small explosive. Upon graduation from Ithaca College, he computer programmed in Boston for a couple years before heading to L.A. to attend the American Film Institute. Since receiving his MFA in screenwriting, he's been writing and living in Pasadena, CA. He's a member of the WGAw, and has a number of feature scripts he hopes to direct next. For several years he taught narrative structure and directed student plays for the internationally acclaimed narrative improv troupe Impro Theatre. In 2010 he made a 3-minute video (L.A. LOVE) as a one-man crew, but THE BUNGLERS (29 minutes) is the first film he's directed with an actual crew. He used no Star Wars models and very few small explosives. Glenn has won 3 Best Director awards and 4 Best Short / Best Short Comedy awards for THE **BUNGLERS.**

KYLE FISCHER

PRODUCER



Kyle grew up in Salem, OR. He received a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration from Northwest Nazarene University, and subsequently started a business before turning his interests to film and video. He was the Creative Director for an Oregon production company, IKE Media, and Producer for a community television station. Kyle also shot video for the Oregon State Legislative Administration, and was a part of an alternative education program that taught video production to high school students and foster boys. After moving to Los Angeles, he interned at Francis Ford Coppola's company (The American Zoetrope), and Charlize Theron's Production Company (Denver and Delilah). Kyle recently received the Tom Yoda Scholarship for his work at AFI, and produced the award-winning short film THULE.


SARA "SAMM" BARNES

CONSULTING PRODUCER

Samm's work as a television writer includes multiple produced episodes written across two seasons of the Showtime cable TV series, JEREMIAH. As a co-producer of that series, she also worked in editing, mixing, prep and production. In 2006-07, she was a producer for BABYLON 5: THE LOST TALES, and produced, edited, wrote, and directed the behind-the-scenes promotional episodes included on the DVD and distributed online. In 2008, she and J. Michael Straczynski formed and independent production company, Imaginary Entertainment, as equal partners to produce motion pictures and television series. In addition she has worked with the Wachowski brothers and their production company Anarchos Productions, in development for a television series, SENSE8. Co-coordinated a film crew to capture B-roll footage in various locations around the world, including Iraq. Samm has published comic books, including co-authoring the DOCTOR STRANGE miniseries, "Strange Beginnings and Endings" for Marvel Comics, as well as issues of THE SPECTACULAR SPIDER-MAN. Her DOCTOR SPECTRUM miniseries, "Full Spectrum," won the Outstanding Canadian Comic Book Writer Award at the 2005 Joe Shuster Awards, for which she was nominated again in 2006.

STEPHAN DALYAL

DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY



Stephan grew up in New Jersey where he developed a passion for the arts and cinema at an early age (staging Star Wars reenactments wherever possible). Having decided to pursue cinematography at the age of 17, he began shooting homemade Super 8 movies and music videos, created a film production class in his high school and worked as a cameraman for the local TV station. He attended New York University's Tisch School of the Arts where he earned an MFA in Film and Television Production, focusing on camera and lighting, and received two "excellence in cinematography" awards for thesis films he DP'd. Stephan also attended the Budapest Film Institutes cinematography program as a way to experience other filmmaking philosophies. She has designed for diverse genres including military, period, comedy and horror, and she approaches each new script with excitement, creativity, and an eagerness to communicate and collaborate.








STEPHEN KEARIN


DANNY



Stephen began his career with Bay Area Theatresports in San Francisco, where he was a company member for 14 years. He was a founding member of both Improv Theatre and True Fiction Magazine. Stephen is currently a member of Impro Theatre in Los Angeles and a founding member of 3 FOR ALL. His stage appearances include the stilt-walking lago in San Francisco Opera's OTELLO, as Sally-Sue Weber in A WEBER FAMILY CHRISTMAS and he originated the role of Blaine Bustier in AN EVENING WITH DIRK & BLAINE. Stephen is the co-creator of "Simlish" and was the principal male voice of THE SIMS, SIMS 2.0 and SIMS MEDIEVAL. He is featured in the DreamWorks Animation films KUNG FU PANDA, KUNG FU PANDA 2, MADAGASCAR 2 & 3, MONSTERS VS. ALIENS and MEGAMIND. He created the Martian languages for Disney's MARS NEEDS MOMS. For his role as Danny in THE BUNGLERS, Stephen won the Best Actor (Featurette) award at the 2013 Idyllwild CinemaFest, and was nominated for Best Actor (M or F) - Short Film at the 2013 Trail Dance Film Festival.

Floyd VanBuskirk is an actor who started professionally on Seattle stages and became very active in the improv scene. He was a member of several improv groups, and the co-founder and first Artistic Director of Seattle Theatresports, now known as Unexpected Productions. He moved to LA in 1995 and joined LA Theatresports, of which he was Education Director then Artistic Director, for two years each. During that period the company changed its name to Impro Theatre, and is now internationally known and critically acclaimed as one of the best long form improvisational theatre ensembles anywhere. They create completely improvised, full length plays in various literary styles and genres: Shakespeare, Chekhov, Dickens, Jane Austen, Tennessee Williams and Sondheim to name a few. Floyd is also a singer-songwriter and member of the band CATAHOULA, which is just releasing its second album "Second Sight." He works extensively in Voice Over for film, TV and radio. Some of his onscreen credits are: CURB YOUR ENTHUSIASM, RENO 911, LAS VEGAS, NCIS, HOW I MET YOUR MOTHER, THE MIDDLE, HART OF DIXIE, blah blah blah yadda yadda yadda and lots of other cool stuff including A MIGHTY WIND directed by Christopher Guest and THE BUNGLERS directed by Glenn Camhi.

BRIAN LOHMANN

JOE DANZER



Brian began improvising professionally at age seventeen in the nightclubs of San Francisco's North Beach. He was founder and artistic director of the award-winning, critically acclaimed "Pulp Playhouse", which was formed at the Eureka Theatre during Oskar Eustis' tenure. He performed Off-Broadway in Improbable Theatre's LIFEGAME, hosted the TV version for TNN, and was theatre games consultant/dialog coach for Francis Ford Coppola. Regional theater acting credits include, The Old Globe Theater, Magic Theater and A.C.T. He has taught for the company of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, The Public Theatre's Shakespeare Lab, NYU's Steinhardt School. Theatre/University of Minnesota, The Huntington LAUSD Shakespeare Workshop, Dell Arte, Victoria College of the Arts in Melbourne, Pepperdine, Stanford and San Francisco State Universities and in Germany and the UK. He was core faculty at A.C.T. for seven years. Impro Theatre directing credits include Dickens UnScripted, Tennessee Williams UnScripted, Shakespeare UnScripted (co-director) and L.A. Brian was composer/cast member for the Noir UnScripted. improv/sketch show "BOO!" at New York New York hotel and casino in Las Vegas. His solo show, Johnny Lonely's Unhappy Hour, was nominated for a Fringe first at the Adelaide Fringe festival and was a critic's choice in Seattle, Melbourne and Edinburgh. Other solo work includes Seasonal Help, at the Bayfront Theater in San Francisco and Captaining Titanic Leadership, at the ACME in Los Angeles. TV and Film appearances include AMERICAN BODY SHOP, WORLD CUP COMEDY, ASK RITA, JACK, HE WAS A QUIET MAN and THANKS, with Rita Rudner.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

With THE BUNGLERS, I wanted to pack a complex, twisty tale into a short film, while making sure it works first and foremost on a character and comic level. I also wanted to make a visually and musically compelling action-comedy about love, trust, and mishaps that's meant to be experienced on the big screen with an audience. Since I prefer films that trust the audience's intelligence and don't spell everything out, THE BUNGLERS is designed to leave you thinking back and hopefully wanting to see it again to answer questions and pick up on additional subtle humor, visual cues and characters' unspoken motives. I also wanted to keep twisting the audience's expectations until the last frame. By the end, viewers will hopefully rethink whom the title really refers to.

I'm always fascinated by the spark that brings two people together, and wanted to make a speedy, unlikely romance believable – while also exploring how sympathetic and likable we could make characters who'd normally repulse us ethically. Love can do funny things to people. It can even make the fool the hero. More or less.

Stylistically, my goal was to tell the tale as much through visuals, color palette and music as through dialogue, in a style that serves and enhances the story without calling too much attention to itself. At heart, it's a love story about characters from seemingly different worlds, so everything from production design to costume, camerawork, lens choices, lighting, score and editing is carefully designed to accentuate that theme. I love how animated films oft start with a "color script" that breaks the entire story down solely through color, and that's how I developed this film's look. It's all meant to work on an intuitive, subconscious level, rather than being obvious. Lastly, I wanted a serious challenge for my first film. I certainly got it – shooting the 29 minute action-comedy with high production value in just 6 days, at 7 main locations around Los Angeles and Altadena, CA, with as many as 41 people on screen in one scene. After editing the film and doing a preliminary sound mix, I learned how to color grade and do some visual effects, while working closely with the composers. Part of the score had been written before production so that I could storyboard and help choreograph to the music, and also so I could play it back on set to help set the mood for the actors. As a further creative challenge, we designed the music in some scenes to shift fluidly from being source (i.e., playing in the actual location) to more overt score, and back. This was done to accentuate the romance plot, and was great fun to pull off. (More on this at the above Design link.)

While it's a comedy, we approached it as we would a serious film. Every department worked in concert to tell the story through a coherent style, down to the smallest detail. As a writer first, I view every step of the filmmaking process as an aspect of writing – all the way to color timing. I'm thrilled everyone's enthusiasm shows on screen!
